



MLB London Series

Major League Baseball (MLB) is focused on increasing awareness of baseball across the globe with the ultimate goal of making our sport a global passion.

Hosting regular-season games internationally showcases the best of MLB to the world. London has now hosted six MLB games in 2019, 2023 and 2024, through the MLB London Series. With another London Series planned for 2026, there has never been a better time to be a baseball fan in the UK.

MLB London Series Legacy Programme

Using the MLB London Series as a spark, the London Series Legacy programme was created with an aim to bring the game of baseball into the mainstream in the UK by supporting the growth of the sport and inspiring a new generation of fans.

To achieve this, the Legacy partners, led by MLB and BaseballSoftball*UK* work to create new playing opportunities for young people, expand and improve clubs, leagues and facilities, and ultimately celebrate and raise the profile of the grassroots game in the UK.

London Series Legacy and MLB First Pitch

MLB First Pitch sits at the heart of our Legacy programme. MLB and BSUK work together to bring special event opportunities for First Pitch schools and to link First Pitch schools up with their local clubs so they can engage with the baseball community in the UK.







Year 1 - New Hub

- Provide and deliver a festival opportunity (equipment pack provided)
- Provide opportunities for young leader training/leaders supporting festivals – secondary pupils (optional)
- Foster school-to-community club connections
- Facilitate monitoring and evaluation data collection of each school in your hub.
- Aspirational: Host and deliver a championship opportunity

Year 3 -Sustained Hub

- Embed competition/festival opportunities for baseball as part of ongoing calendar of events
- Provide opportunities for young leader training/leaders supporting festivals – secondary pupils
- Foster school-to-community club connections
- Engagement with BaseballSoftballUK for continued support and development
